



Reed Avenue Improvement Projects:

Phase 1 - I Street to Manning Avenue:

The City of Reedley has completed Phase 1 in May of 2017. The first phase of the project constructed the roundabout at the intersection of Reed and North Avenues, replaced or upgraded water and sewer mains, and reconstructed the pavement on Reed from I Street to Reed Avenue and on North Avenue from Reed to G Street.

Underground Utility Project:

The City just finished the construction of a joint utility trench project on Reed Avenue from just north of Manning Avenue to Aspen Avenue. The joint trench was constructed in preparation of utility companies, PG&E, Comcast and Frontier Communications, placing their overhead power and utility lines underground in this trench and removal of the poles. Over the next few months the utility companies will be working on placing their overhead lines in this trench and removing some of the poles. During that time there will be periodic lane closures or realignment of traffic to accommodate construction.

Phase 2 – Manning to South Avenues:

The second phase of the Reed Avenue roadway reconstruction is scheduled to begin in the Spring of 2018. The project will include some replacements and upgrading of water and sewer facilities, but the majority of the project will be roadway reconstruction or rehabilitation from Manning to South Avenues. This project will include complete and partial roadway closures of Reed Avenue at various times during construction. Clearly delineated detours will be provided for traffic during the complete closures of the roadway. The City will work with the contractor to provide at least 72 hours notice of road closures and/or traffic modifications. Notices will be provided via changeable message signs, City website, and recorded message phone calls to residents in English and Spanish. The project is anticipated to be completed in September of 2018.
